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11	Article I. Name and Relationship to American Physical Therapy Association
12	The American Council of Academic Physical Therapy, hereinafter referred to as ACAPT,
13	shall be an institutional group of the American Physical Therapy Association, hereinafter
14	referred to as the Association.
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16	Article II: Purpose
17	The purposes of ACAPT are:
18	A) To develop, implement and assess new and innovative models for curricula, clinical
19	education, teaching/learning, scholarship/research, mentoring, and leadership in physical
20	therapist education;
21	B) To provide mechanisms for active and ongoing involvement of physical therapist
22	educators and researchers to promote quality physical therapist education standards at the
23	institutional and national levels;
24	C) To promote academic physical therapist education through collaboration with
25	organizations and institutions that represent health professional education; and

26	D) To provide resources, mentorship and leadership to those seeking change and
27	improvement in academic programs/departments/schools associated with physical
28	therapist education.
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31	Article III. Membership
32	Section 1: Categories and Qualification of Members
33	ACAPT shall have members in the categories set forth below:
34	A) Member Institutions
35	1) Institutions of higher education located in the United States of America with a
36	physical therapist education program that is accredited by the Commission on
37	Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) and pays the annual dues to
38	ACAPT shall be Member Institutions of ACAPT.
39	2) Member Institutions shall be represented by one full-time core academic faculty
40	member (as defined by CAPTE) in the program as designated by the program director
41	(hereinafter referred to as the Representative.)
42	a. Member Institutions shall identify their Representative each year at the time dues
43	are paid.
44	b. Member Institutions with more than one separately accredited physical therapist
45	education program may have one Representative for each of those accredited
46	physical therapist education programs.
47	c. Each Representative from any Member Institution must be a member in good
48	standing of the Association.
49	d. The Member Institution may change their Representative by written notice at any
50	time to the American Council of Academic Physical Therapy (ACAPT).

- e. Academic and clinical education faculty (as defined by the Physical Therapy
 Clinical Education Glossary) of a Member Institution shall have access to ACAPT
 resources as determined by the Board.
- 54 B) Provisional Institutional Members shall be Institutions of higher education located in the
- 55 United States of America with a physical therapist education program that are CAPTE-
- 56 recognized pre-accreditation developing programs who have either submitted an
- 57 Application for Candidacy but have not yet received Candidate for Accreditation status
- 58 (PT candidacy Category B) or who have notified the Department of Accreditation that a
- 59 Program Director has been employed (PT candidacy Category C) and pays the annual
- 60 dues to ACAPT shall be Provisional Institutional Members of ACAPT.

61 Section 2: Rights of Representatives of Member Institutions

- 62 A) Representatives of Member Institutions shall have the following rights:
- 63 1) To attend all ACAPT business meetings
- 64 2) To speak and debate
- 65 3) To make, co-sponsor, and second motions
- 66 4) To vote
- 67 5) To hold office
- 6) To designate an individual from the academic faculty of the Member Institution with authority to act according to the above rights on behalf of the Representative in his or her absence. Delegation of the authority of the Representative of a Member Institution to an individual from the academic faculty from the same institution must be submitted in writing to ACAPT by the Representative of the Member Institution (or, in extenuating circumstances, by an administrative representative of the Member Institution) at least 1 week in advance of exercising a Member Institution's right to

75	representation or hand-carried by the individual from academic faculty into a
76	business meeting and presented to the Secretary prior to the start of the meeting.
77	B) Academic and clinical education faculty from Member Institutions shall have the
78	following rights:
79	1) To attend all ACAPT business meetings
80	2) To speak and debate
81	3) To make motions that are co-sponsored by the Member Institution's Representative
82	4) To serve in appointed positions
83	Section 3: Application for and Admission to Membership
84	Membership Institutions: Payment of ACAPT dues by Member Institutions shall constitute
85	application for and admission to membership.
86	Section 4: Good Standing
87	Member Institutions in good standing shall be entitled to all rights and privileges as outlined
88	in these Bylaws. Member Institutions are in good standing within the meaning of these
89	Bylaws if they Make timely payments of all ACAPT dues and maintain accreditation through
90	CAPTE.
91	Section 5: Disciplinary Action
92	A) Member Institutions:
93	1) A Member Institution whose dues have not been received by forty five (45) calendar
94	days before the Annual Meeting shall be considered to be in arrears and its
95	membership rights shall be suspended. If the dues are not received within fourteen
96	(14) calendar days before the Annual Meeting, the membership shall be automatically
97	revoked and the membership rights of the institution shall terminate.
98	2) If a Member Institution no longer has a program accredited by CAPTE then the
99	institution shall cease to be a Member Institution of ACAPT and its membership

100	rights shall terminate. If one of the separately accredited programs of a Member
101	Institution with more than one such program is no longer accredited by CAPTE then
102	the Representative associated with that program shall cease to be a Representative and
103	may not exercise any membership rights on behalf of the Member Institution.
104	3) Academic or clinical education faculty of a Member Institution who are suspended or
105	expelled by the Association and/or Member Institution shall automatically have their
106	institutional membership rights suspended.
107	Section 6: Reinstatement
108	Academic or clinical education faculty of a Member Institution who are in good standing in
109	the Member Institution may be reinstated to ACAPT.
110	
111	Article IV. Meetings and Authority of the Representatives
112	Section 1: Annual Meeting
113	A) An Annual Meeting of the Member Institutions shall be held for the purpose of
114	conducting ACAPT's business and other activities in accordance with the purposes of
115	ACAPT. At the Annual Meeting, or at any special meeting, the Representatives, or the
116	Representative's designee, shall have the power to:
117	1) Amend or repeal these Bylaws;
118	2) Enact policies of ACAPT;
119	3) Approve all resolutions and statements of opinion in the name of ACAPT.
120	The Annual Meeting shall be held once per year on a day as determined by the Board of
121	Directors.
122	B) Motions
123	1) Proposed motions shall be submitted to ACAPT's Board of Directors no later than
124	two months prior to the date of the Annual Meeting.

126 Annual Meeting upon a vote of 2/3 of those Representatives present and voting. The

127 Board of Directors shall make motions available to the Representatives no later than

- 128 30 days prior to the date of the Annual Meeting. Last minute motions shall be
- 129 distributed to all Representatives at the start of a meeting.
- 130 C) Eligibility to Speak and Vote
- 131 1) All Representatives, or their designee, and academic and clinical education faculty
- 132 may speak; attendees who are not members of the ACAPT must receive permission of
- 133 the Representatives to speak. Only Representatives, or their designee, may vote.
- 134 Section 2: Special Meeting(s)
- 135 The Board of Directors may call a special meeting of the Representatives of Member
- 136 Institutions, and the Board of Directors shall call a special meeting upon receipt of written
- 137 petitions from Representatives representing at least 50% of the Member Institutions.
- 138 Section 3: Meeting Notice
- 139 Written notification of the time and place of a meeting shall be sent to all Member Institution
- 140 Representatives at least 30 days before the scheduled meeting.
- 141 Section 4: Quorum
- 142 A quorum shall consist of Representatives representing 50% of the total number of the
- 143 Member Institutions in good standing.

144 Section 5: Minutes

- 145 The Board of Directors shall appoint a committee to correct and approve the Annual Meeting
- 146 minutes. The committee to approve the minutes shall consist of two board members and one
- 147 member at large. The committee shall be appointed in advance of the annual meeting and
- 148 complete their work no later than 45 days after the annual meeting.

149	All approved meeting minutes shall be (a) submitted to all Representatives of ACAPT as well
150	as the Association and (b) posted to the ACAPT website within 45 days of the date of the
151	meeting.
152	
153	Article V. Officers, Board of Directors, Executive Committee
154	Section 1: Composition
155	A) The Board of Directors of ACAPT shall consist of the President, Vice-President,
156	Secretary, Treasurer, and five at large Directors.
157	B) The Executive Committee of ACAPT shall consist of the President, Vice-President,
158	Secretary, Treasurer, and one of the at large Directors who shall be selected annually by
159	the at large Directors at the first meeting of the Board of Directors following their
160	installation as officers.
161	Section 2: Eligibility
162	Only the Representatives of Member Institutions are eligible to serve on the Board of
163	Directors.
164	Section 3: Officers
165	The Officers of ACAPT shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and
166	Treasurer.
167	A) President
168	1) The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and Executive

- 169 Committee.
- 170 2) The President, or a person designated by the President, shall be the spokesperson for
- 171 ACAPT.
- 172 3) The President shall submit to ACAPT members an annual written report of the
- 173 activities of ACAPT at the Annual Meeting.

174	4) The President shall perform all other duties assigned to them by the Board of
175	Directors.
176	B) Vice-President
177	1) The Vice President shall preside at all meetings of the Representatives of Member
178	Institutions.
179	2) The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President if the President is absent
180	or incapacitated.
181	3) In the event of a vacancy in the office of the President, the Vice-President shall
182	succeed to the Presidency for the unexpired remainder of the term and the office of
183	Vice-President shall be declared vacant.
184	4) The Vice-President shall perform all other duties regularly expected of such office
185	and those assigned by the Board of Directors or the President.
186	C) Secretary
187	1) The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping and distributing the minutes of all
188	meetings of the Representatives, the Executive Committee, and the Board of
189	Directors.
190	2) The Secretary shall be responsible for all notices to members of ACAPT.
191	3) The Secretary shall maintain records of all official actions of the Representatives, the
192	Board of Directors, and the Executive Committee.
193	4) The Secretary shall, in general, perform all of the duties customary to the office of
194	Secretary and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned by the President
195	or the Board of Directors.
196	D) Treasurer

197	1) The Treasurer shall be responsible for presenting the annual budget to the Board of
198	Directors, maintaining complete and accurate financial records, and providing a
199	written financial report at the Annual Meeting of ACAPT.
200	2) The Treasurer shall serve as the Chair of the Finance Committee of ACAPT.
201	3) The Treasurer shall provide for an audit of the financial records of ACAPT at least
202	annually.
203	4) The Treasurer shall provide required financial reports to the Association.
204	5) The Treasurer shall provide financial reports to the Board of Directors at least
205	quarterly or upon request by the Board.
206	6) The Treasurer shall keep accurate records of all receipts and disbursements related to
207	the workings of ACAPT.
208	7) The Treasurer shall, in general, perform all of the duties customary to the office of
209	Treasurer and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned by the President
210	or the Board of Directors.
211	Section 4: Tenure
212	A) Members of the Board of Directors shall assume office at the close of business at the
213	Annual Meeting of the Member Institutions in the year in which they are elected.
214	B) The term of office of each member of the Board of Directors shall be for three years or
215	until a successor is elected and takes office.
216	C) No person shall serve more than two complete consecutive terms on the Board of
217	Directors or more than 2 complete consecutive terms in the same office. A member who
218	has completed their terms of office is eligible to run again after taking off at least one
219	election cycle.

220 D) A complete term for a member of the Board of Directors shall be defined as 3 years.

221	E) Vacancies: Except for the position of President, if a vacancy occurs on the Board of
222	Directors within the first year of a 3-year term and at least two months before the Annual
223	Meeting, the Nominating Committee shall select a candidate(s) for election at the next
224	Annual Meeting, and the person elected at that Meeting shall serve the remainder of the
225	term. If any other vacancy occurs, the Board of Directors shall fill the vacancy by
226	appointing a person to serve for the remainder of the term. When less than one half a term
227	remains, the appointed individual shall be eligible to be elected to two additional terms.
228	Section 5: Duties
229	A) The Board of Directors shall:
230	1) Carry out the mandates and policies of ACAPT. Between Annual Meetings the Board
231	of Directors may make and enforce such policy on behalf of ACAPT as is not
232	inconsistent with the mandates and policies determined by ACAPT.
233	2) Foster the growth and development of ACAPT.
234	3) Direct all business and financial affairs of ACAPT, including approving an annual
235	budget.
236	4) Be responsible for creation, appointment, purposes and activities of such committees
237	as it deems necessary.
238	5) Be responsible for the program, time, and place of the Annual Meeting of ACAPT.
239	6) Be responsible for development and maintenance of procedural documents related to
240	these Bylaws.
241	7) Review and revise existing ACAPT policies, and the Bylaws, for consistency of intent
242	and language with such policies as may be adopted from time to time by ACAPT.
243	B) Executive Committee
244	The Executive Committee may act in lieu of the Board of Directors between meetings of
245	the Board of Directors, and shall report its actions at the next meeting of the Board.

- 246 Section 6: Conduct of Business 247 A) Board of Directors The Board of Directors shall meet not less than twice a year. A majority of the members 248 249 of the Board shall constitute a quorum. The President may call a special meeting of the 250 Board of Directors and must call a special meeting on written request of a majority of the 251 members of the Board. 252 B) Executive Committee 253 The Executive Committee shall meet not less than twice a year and shall exercise the 254 power of the Board of Directors between its meetings. A majority of the Executive 255 Committee members shall constitute a quorum. 256 257 Article VI. Committees The following will be Standing Committees of ACAPT: 258 259 **Section 1: Finance Committee** 260 A) The Finance Committee shall consist of the Treasurer and at least two other individuals 261 who are academic or clinical education faculty of a Member Institution appointed by the 262 ACAPT Board of Directors. Those appointed by the ACAPT Board of Directors shall
 - serve a term of 3 years. In each year in which the Treasurer is not elected, the Board of
 - 264 Directors shall appoint at least one member.
 - B) The Finance Committee shall advise the Board of Directors on matters pertaining to
 - ACAPT's financial needs, growth, and stability based on periodic review of income,expenditures, and investments.
 - 268 C) The Finance Committee shall present an annual budget to the Board of Directors.
 - 269 D) The Finance Committee shall be the point of contact and meet at least annually with
 - 270 ACAPT's independent auditors to discuss the annual audit. The Finance Committee shall

- advise the Board of Directors of any irregularities or material findings that arise from the
- independent audit or other sources.

273 Section 2: Nominating Committee

- A) The Nominating Committee, elected by the Representatives, shall consist of three
- individuals who are academic faculty of Member Institutions.
- B) Members of the Nominating Committee shall serve a three year term or until their
- successors are elected. The term of one member shall expire each year. No member shallbe elected to successive complete terms.
- 279 C) Members of the Nominating Committee shall assume office at the Annual Meeting of the
- 280 Representatives of the Member Institutions in the year in which they are elected.
- 281 D) The Chair shall be elected annually by the Nominating Committee.
- E) Vacancies on the Nominating Committee shall be filled by appointment by the Board of
- 283 Directors until the next Annual Meeting of ACAPT, when an election will be held to fill
- the unexpired portion of the term.
- 285 F) The Nominating Committee shall, in addition to the duties otherwise directed by the
- 286 Board of Directors or Member Institutions:
- 287 1) Provide a slate of candidates for each position from those consenting to serve. This
 288 slate of candidates shall be published and made available to Representatives as soon
- as available, but no later than two months before the Annual Meeting.
- 290 2) Foster activities that maintain and promote a pool of qualified nominees.
- 291 Section 3: Reference Committee
- A) The Reference Committee shall consist of three individuals who are academic or clinical
- education faculty of a Member Institution appointed by the Board of Directors, and the
- 294 Vice-President, who shall serve as an ex officio member of the Reference Committee.

295 B) Members of the Reference Committee other than the Vice-President shall serve a three 296 year term with at least one new member appointed no later than November 1 of each 297 year. 298 299 **Article VII: Elections and Voting** 300 The Representatives shall elect the members of the Board of Directors and a members of the 301 Nominating Committee. Elections shall be conducted online or in such other manner as the 302 Board of Directors may provide. Elections shall be conducted each year in advance of the 303 Annual Meeting, at such time as the Board of Directors may provide. 304 On petition of at least 5 Member Institutions, a qualified consenting member shall be placed 305 in nomination for a position as an officer, director, or as a member of the Nominating 306 Committee to serve as a nomination by petition. Such a petition must be filed with the 307 Secretary no later than 14 days after the list of candidates prepared by the Nominating

308 Committee has been distributed to members. A candidate nominated by petition shall be

309 afforded similar opportunities for publication of candidacy to the membership as those

310 afforded a candidate nominated by the Nominating Committee.

Article VIII: Finance

- 313 Section 1: Fiscal Year
- 314 The fiscal year of ACAPT shall be January 1 through December 31.
- 315 Section 2: Expenditures
- 316 A) Individuals and committees
- No officer, director, employee, committee member, or committee shall expend any
 funds not established in the adopted budget, nor expend any money in excess of the
 adopted budget, unless expressly authorized by the Board of Directors.

- B) Board of Directors and Executive Committee
- 321 2) Neither the Board of Directors nor the Executive Committee shall commit ACAPT to
- 322 any financial obligations in excess of its current financial resources.

323 Section 3: Dues. Membership dues shall be as follows:

- 324 A) Member Institutions
- 325 Annual dues for each separately accredited program shall be established by the ACAPT
- 326 Board of Directors.
- 327 B) Pro-rated
- 328 Institutions of higher education located in the United States of America with a physical
- 329 therapist education program that obtain initial accreditation from CAPTE in the Fall may
- pay half of the established Annual dues January 1 June 30 following their initial
- 331 accreditation.
- 332 C) Assessments
- 333 ACAPT may impose assessments on Member Institutions to preserve the solvency of
- 334 ACAPT.
- 335 Section 4: Audits and Financial Reports
- 336 ACAPT shall submit its annual audits, financial statements, and tax returns to the Association
- as directed by the Association.
- 338
- 339

Article IX. Institutes

- 340 Section 1. Definition
- 341 There shall be four (4) Institutes:
- Academic Advancement
- Teaching & Learning
- Scholarly Inquiry

• Community Engagement

Each institute shall have a chair and vice chair elected by the Representatives to coordinate its activities. The chair and vice chair shall be an academic or clinical education faculty in good standing of a Member Institution. The term shall be for one year, and shall commence at the close of the Annual Meeting of the Representatives of the Member Institutions in the year in which elected. Following completion of a term as vice chair, the vice chair shall automatically assume the position of chair. No member shall be elected to successive complete terms.

353 **Proviso:** The inaugural Chair will serve a term of two years and the inaugural Vice
354 Chair will serve a total of three years, two as Vice Chair and one as Chair. Successive
355 elections shall be only for the Vice Chair position.

356

A) The Institute of Academic Advancement shall support and promote institutional
 characteristics that reflect an intentional pursuit of excellence. This Institute shall
 encourage institutional programmatic and clinical development; foster leadership
 excellence; advance diversity, equity, and inclusion; and facilitate programmatic
 innovation.

B) The Institute of Teaching & Learning shall support and promote curricular attributes
that ensure outcomes of educational excellence. This Institute will help to encourage
institutional educational excellence; facilitate excellence in clinical education; foster
curricular innovation; advance educational technology; and integrate professional
formation.

367 C) The Institute of Scholarly Inquiry shall cultivate a culture of scholarship and research
 368 and ongoing assessment of outcomes in academic programs. This Institute shall
 369 support scientific research to grow the profession; encourage implementation of
 370 discoveries into practice and education; develop best practices for scientific,

371	educational, and community-based research; cultivate research leadership and
372	bolster educational preparation through research outcomes.
373	D) The Institute of Community Engagement shall support and promote community and
374	stakeholder engagement in the shared pursuit of excellence. This Institute shall
375	promote educational and clinical partnerships; engage in societal health and
376	wellness; and enhance engagement across healthcare disciplines.
377	
378	Section 2. Vacancies
379	Vacancies in the position of chair or vice chair shall be filled by appointment by the Board of
380	Directors to fill the unexpired portion of the term.
381	
382	Article X. Dissolution
383	A) The Member Institutions, through their Representatives, shall be entitled to vote on any
384	proposal to dissolve ACAPT, which may be dissolved in accordance with § 13.1-902 of
385	the Virginia Nonstock Corporation Act.
386	B) All property and records of whatsoever nature in the possession of ACAPT shall be
387	distributed in accordance with § 13.1-907(A)(1-3) of the Virginia Nonstock Corporation
388	Act, and thereafter after payment of all bona fide debts, the remaining property and
389	records shall be turned over to the Association.
390	
391	Article XI. Parliamentary Authority
392	The rules contained in the twelfth edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised govern
393	ACAPT in all cases to which such rules are applicable and in which such rules are consistent
394	with these Bylaws and any special rules of order adopted by ACAPT.
395	

396	Article XII. Amendments
397	A) The Bylaws may be amended at any business meeting of ACAPT at which there is a
398	quorum present by two-thirds of those present and voting.
399	B) Notification of a proposed amendment shall be given to the Member Institutions at least
400	30 days prior to a business meeting.
401	Article XIII. Association as Higher Authority
402	In addition to these Bylaws, ACAPT is governed by the Association's Bylaws and standing
403	rules, and by the Association's House of Delegates and Board of Director policies.
404
