CANDIDATE STATEMENT

I am interested in contributing to the development of clinical reasoning frameworks for Competency-Based Education (CBE), and Entrustable Professional Activities (EPA) for entry level DPT programs. While some APTA academies have created recommendations for competencies for entry-level education, as a Profession we need to develop best practice standards for teaching and assessing clinical reasoning that is consistent with developing the master adaptive learner in a CBE curriculum. Moreover, designing curricula or modifying established curricula, around this concept requires a diverse community of perspectives to be implemented successfully. The nominating committee is an opportunity to create a network of educators, develop relationships and learn from others who have similar interests, but may have different vantage points. A member of the nominating committee should be organized and accountable. I feel these are personal strengths that will support the nominating committee position, where members are responsible for inviting others to contribute their expertise while organizing and communicating information amongst members of the consortia.
